 Historians, anthropologists, and other scholars have identified several core characteristics of civilization.



1: Urban Centers

 Urban centers, of course, would include cities or villages throughout the territory occupied by a civilization.





2: Agricultural Manipulation and storage

- Agricultural manipulation and storage is important because it allows people to ensure their future livelihood, rather than just scrounge for food on a day-by-day basis.
- This would include **Irrigation**. **Irrigation** allows for the growth of crops, and in some cases, clean drinking water and even plumbing.

3: Written Language

 Written language unites a people, and allows them to communicate ideas with

one another.





4: System of Measurement

 A common system of measurements means that two people understand the same quantity of an object, distance,

5: Technology/ Craftsmanship


 Craftsmanship technology allows for the building of complex structures, tools, and

7: State Government
